BUILD UP MARIETTA ALLOCATED \$21,000

Our building improvement program, Build Up Marietta, allocated \$21,000 this year, leveraging over \$44,173 in downtown building improvements. Through 10 projects, these funds facilitated both interior and exterior enhancements, including lighting and design, walk-in coolers, HVAC and exhaust systems, ADA accessibility, awnings, cornice repair, and more.



BIKE MARIETTA PROPOSAL RECEIVES \$10,000

The Washington County Health Department awarded \$10,000 to Bike Marietta, a proposal we put forward to further uplift outdoor recreation in our community. We have purchased 50 new bike racks for downtown, designed a Bike Marietta Resource Guide, coordinated a bike-friendly business initiative, and will soon launch a Bike Marietta web page and install kiosks with trail maps and other resources.



INVESTMENT OF \$8.200 IN PUBLIC ART

Our Public Art Committee invested over \$8,200 this year in the installation of three murals. Two murals were installed to finish the Butler Street Historic Photo Mural Series and in September, we hosted a collaborative pop-up mural day with 14 local artists who painted a series of murals between Front and Second Street.



DORA APPLICATION DRAFTED

We drafted an application for downtown Marietta to become a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) and submitted it to City Council. With a few updates, we look forward to accomplishing this goal in 2021 and thus adding another tool to our economic development toolkit to generate revenue for downtown bars & restaurants and retailers.



AWARDED \$18.064 IN BUSINESS RELIEF

Through our newly-launched Downtown Small Business Relief Fund we awarded \$18,094 to 11 businesses to support equipment & supply purchases, marketing & advertising, rent relief, and technical training & support in the wake of COVID-19.



DISTRIBUTED PPE TO DOWNTOWN BUSINESSES

We distributed 50 boxes of PPE including hand sanitizer and masks to downtown businesses to ensure they have the resources they need to adhere to local, state, and federal health orders. In total, through these boxes, we distributed 5,000 3-ply masks, 1,000 KN95 masks, and 1,200 ounces of hand sanitizer.



SUCCESSFULLY ADVOCATED FOR BED TAX INCREASE TO CVB

In partnership with the Marietta-Washington County CVB and the Southeastern Ohio Port Authority, we successfully advocated for the increase of the bed tax allocation received by the CVB, a percentage of which will come to Marietta Main Street to support our operations.






VIRTUAL CASH MOBS GENERATED OVER \$40,000 IN REVENUE FOR BUSINESSES

We launched a series of Virtual Cash Mobs, which generated over \$40,000 in revenue for nearly 30 downtown businesses. Some businesses have shared that if it were not for the revenue generated during their Virtual Cash Mob, they would not have been able to make rent that month.



CELEBRATED FLANDERS FIELD IMPROVEMENTS

A ribbon-cutting was celebrated at Flanders Field thanks to the leadership of Main Street West, who successfully improved the park through playground equipment upgrades, public art, resealing of the basketball court, and more.



ENRICH MARIETTA PLAN FINALIZED

We finalized our downtown comprehensive development plan - an 82-page document - based on data and action-oriented priorities for the continued strengthening of downtown. Enrich Marietta, the name of this effort, will be a focus of 2021 and beyond.



AWARD RECEIVED FROM MARIETTA COLLEGE

We were honored to receive the Linsley Community Partner Organization Award from Marietta College during their Founder's Day dinner and celebration.



Main Street communities are resilient ones. 
WE RESPONDED TO COVID-19 TO KEEP DOWNTOWN ALIVE

In March 2020, the world changed and in downtown Marietta, the effects of COVID-19 were met by our Board of Directors with a spirit of innovation & resilience. In response to the Coronavirus, we:

- Continually disseminated updated information regarding relief funds
- Created the COVID-19 Local Resource Guide
- Promoted a Support Local campaign to encourage the array of opportunities to stay connected in Marietta
- Administered 2 surveys to understand the local impact of COVID-19 on downtown businesses
- Launched the Give Big, Help Small campaign to fund our first-ever Downtown Small Business Relief Fund
- Created the Virtual Cash Mob event series to bridge the gap between consumers and businesses online
- Distributed PPE to businesses & organizations
- Shifted events to a virtual platform, keeping the focus on downtown
- Provided small business support & training on social media marketing and e-commerce



PUBLIC ART INITIATIVES BROUGHT ARTISTS TOGETHER TO ADD COLOR & CARE



In a year full of so much struggle and worry, our Public Art Committee focused on hope, vibrancy, and collaboration to enhance downtown and our community as a whole. Comprised of area artists, including downtown employees and business owners, our Public Art Committee had a milestone year in accomplishments, investing nearly \$9,000.

- The two final panels on the Butler Street Historic Photo Mural Series were installed
- The Pop-Up Collaborative Mural Series was designed and painted, bringing together 14 area artists to beautify an alleyway and parking structure. A video was created to capture the process that can be found on our YouTube Channel.
- Plans for 2021 were generated, including approval of a mural design by artist Alix Northrup to be installed at 197 Front Street featuring the message "Rooted in Kindness, Good Things Grow Here"
- Internal policies were drafted to ensure the work of the Committee is equitable and consistently applied






